

Responsible Wood Sourcing Policy

Sklar Furnishings is committed to the responsible use of forest resources and to improving transparency around the wood used in the furniture we offer.

Our Commitment

We work with our suppliers on an ongoing basis to eliminate wood from unacceptable sources and to progressively increase the use of responsibly sourced wood, including wood from certified, recycled, and reclaimed sources. We believe responsible sourcing supports healthier forests, stronger communities, and a more transparent furniture supply chain.

Wood from Unacceptable Sources

Sklar Furnishings is committed to avoiding wood connected to:

- Illegal harvesting or trade;
- Conflict timber or financing of armed conflict;
- Violations of Indigenous peoples', traditional, local community, or civil rights;
- Threats to high conservation values caused by poor forest management;
- Conversion of natural forests to plantations or non-forest use;
- Deforestation or forest degradation;
- Forests in which genetically modified trees are planted; or
- Sources lacking legally required harvesting or trade documentation.

Preferred Responsible Sources

Sklar recognizes the Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) as an important tool for promoting responsible forest management. When products meet our design, quality, performance, and client requirements, we prefer furniture made with FSC-certified wood. We also support reclaimed wood, recycled wood, other credible forest certifications, and responsibly managed plantation-grown wood when appropriate documentation is available.

How We Put the Policy into Practice

Supplier Engagement and Documentation

Sklar communicates this policy to its furniture vendors and asks them to identify the origin, certification status, and recycled or reclaimed content of the wood used in their products. Vendors are encouraged to improve traceability and increase their use of responsibly sourced materials.

When available, Sklar requests supporting documentation such as FSC certificates, chain-of-custody information, certification numbers and expiration dates, product specifications, supplier declarations, invoices, and collection- or SKU-level sourcing records. These records support our annual review and public reporting.

Measurement and 2030 Goal

For the 2026 reporting period, 36% of Sklar Furnishings' active furniture vendors report using responsibly sourced wood in the furniture they produce. Our goal is to increase this percentage to at least 58% by December 31, 2030.

Sklar will review this vendor-reported measure annually. As verified purchasing information becomes available, we will also work toward reporting separate percentages for FSC-certified wood furniture, reclaimed or recycled wood furniture, and other qualifying responsible wood categories. For purchasing-based reporting, Sklar intends to use a consistent annual reporting period and annual net purchase dollars for wood furniture as the calculation basis.

Product Transparency

We are working to make responsible sourcing information easier for clients and designers to understand. Where vendor documentation supports the claim, qualifying products may be identified using clear terms such as FSC Certified, Certified Wood, Reclaimed Wood, Recycled Wood, and Responsibly Sourced Wood.

Annual Review and Accountability

Sklar will periodically review this policy, vendor responses, supporting documentation, and progress toward our 2030 goal. We will update our public sustainability information as our data improves and will correct or remove claims that cannot be adequately supported.

Our commitment is ongoing: Ask better questions, improve documentation, expand responsible choices, and report our progress clearly.
